This month, I spoke with Ned Giddings, one of our residents from "The Heights", we had an interesting discussion regarding how life was during the war and how much it has changed from now. He mentioned about how kerosene fridges were as expensive as fridges today are, Communications were limited to only six phones for fourteen people. People had to be really careful with the way they used fuel as it was only limited to 100 gallons during the war, the only vehicle that would really been seen was the odd one broken down or the postman delivering the post. Ned mentioned that he likes woodwork and used to work on many excellent pieces of work such as a model horse and cart, he enjoyed doing this over the years and misses doing this. Ned shared with me many memories about how things were in his day. We also discussed his favourite food which Ned said he isn't fussy as long as it is edible; we also discussed how he enjoys Men's shed. We talked about how food storage was much different to what it is today and that the ice in the ice boxes would be melted by the time they got to their destination. Ned also discussed how the Ambulance took much longer than it does today as vehicles were much different. Ned talked about how he used to help water his daughters garden and enjoyed doing that.



On Wednesday 12th June the café was well attended by residents as always and all continue to have a good morning socializing and enjoying a cuppa with a biscuit or cake, the café is open from 9:30am throughout the week and all are always welcome. Families are welcome to come share a tea or coffee with us for a small donation.
